## Problem 16: Timetable for G Squad

## **Teaching and observation points**

- > using 24 hour time
- > converting between minutes and hours and back
- working systematically to create a time table





- 2. Three laps of the crosscountry track allowing 15 minutes a lap.






5. Three shooting rounds of 25 minutes each.
